'Dorothy Erickson'

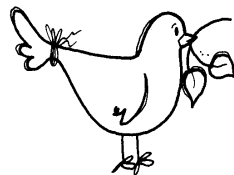

This beautiful pink fuchsia on the front cover was hybridized for Dorothy Erickson before her death at the age of 91.

She and her husband, Robert, owned a fuchsia nursery during the 1950's. It was named Suzanne Gardens and was on Stockton Avenue, San Jose. They hybridized over 20 fuchsias. Among those were: 'Ruffles', 'Glitters', 'Coed', 'Lorna Doone', and the still popular fuchsia, 'Dark Eyes'. Robert died in 1993.

In 1999 Dorothy moved to Crescent City and was a member of the Crescent City Branch. Before her death she had this fuchsia hybridized with her name. It was introduced by Erickson c/o Don Helsel.

Don Helsel entered this photo in the 2023 AFS Photography Contest Class A and won second place.*



'Swingtime' Reprise

Horace Tiret, hybridizer of 'Swingtime' and I were pretty good friends in earlier days. Tiret himself was quite surprised at the success of 'Swingtime'. He had produced 'Yuletide' two years earlier (1948) that was a parent of 'Swingtime'. The flowers were very similar on each, but Tiret thought that 'Swingtime' had basket possibilities whereas 'Yuletide' was an up-right.

Ironically, Tiret did not think 'Swingtime' was worthy enough to patent as he had done with so many of his other introductions both before and after 'Swingtime'. At the time he produced it he thought of it as just another of the many red and white varieties already on the market. (Horace would later say this was a mistake.)

Actually, Tiret attributed much of the success of 'Swingtime' to a lucky choice of name, 'Swingtime' was catchy, easy to pronounce, easy to remember and had a pleasant sound to it that people liked.

On one occasion in the past

Horace and I were invited to judge together for the California National Fuchsia Society. This was for their 1956 Midsummer Shade Plant Show held in June at the Long Beach Auditorium. During the course of our judging, we came upon a plant of 'Swingtime', which was still fairly new at the time, in the section of fuchsia standards. The plant was huge. The best I have ever seen. About five feet high, as I recall, but it was the crown I remember best. A perfect umbrella shape with at least six feet circumference of full foliage and laden with hundreds of blooms. Horace was amazed. He said, "I never thought it ('Swingtime') could grow this big!" Of course, we had no trouble at all in naming it "Best in Show".*

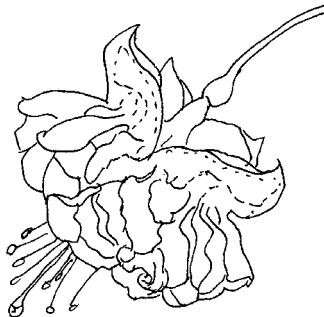
*The fuchsia is famed,

Do you have an Insect Control Plan, ICP ?

Fuchsias only have a few pests you need to control, Aphids, Whitefly, Spider



Mites, and fuchsia gall mites. When should you start an ICP (Insect Control plan)?

Answer: When you first notice the pests on your plants or start a preventive plan in the spring when you prune.

Important: If you do not clean up an infestation, i.e., remove all eggs, fungus, or rust in the spring when you prune, you're setting yourself up for a disappointing fuchsia year.

Recommendations;

- Identify target pest or fungus (take a sample to nursery) in a plastic bag.
- Always Check with local nursery to see if new products are available.
- Always use the Least toxic product that will adequately do the job.
- Always Read the product label (does it list the pest you

are trying to treat)?

- Always read and follow safety instructions. Example: **Horticultural oils.** Do not apply to plants if the temperature is above 80 degrees.

- Always water plants before applying pest or fungus control products.

Important product Info:

Manufacturer labels state the following: It is unrealistic to believe one application of any product will have a 100% kill ratio. Therefore most products always recommend 2-3 applications.

Horticultural Oils:

Horticultural oils usually are applied in two different strengths.

- a. Winter or Dormant strength. (Plant has NO leaves)
- b. All year-round strength. (Plant has leaves) product application only reduces the number of insects.
- c. Horticultural oils have an advantage in that they smother the adults and cover the eggs so they cannot hatch.
- d. Horticultural oils are only effective if you remove the leaves on the plant so you can thoroughly soak the stems.



Insecticides and Fungicides:

Important product note:
All the University websites I checked provided the following advice. Insects damage plant leaves, that's what they do, however the plant damage caused by insects normally does not kill the plant. The amount of toxic chemicals necessary to clean all the insects off of a plant is considered excessive when you consider the value of the ornamental plant and the harm you may cause to yourself and the long-range impact it will have on the environment.

70% Isopropyl Rubbing:

Alcohol is nontoxic and very effective against aphids, whitefly, spider mites and fuchsia gall mites and ants. Mix: Add one cup of 70% Isopropyl rubbing alcohol to a quart container then add some drops of liquid soap as a sticking agent. Fill the quart jar with water, mix/stir. Pour into a spray bottle. This solution is a contact spray so it must come in contact with the insect to be effective. For Whiteflies: Apply every 3-4 days to clean up an infestation.

Rust: Remove all infected leaves, then add one tablespoon of hydrogen peroxide in a gallon of water, mix/stir. Thoroughly spray the complete plant, top, bottom, and trunk.

Sanitize Containers:

Chlorine Bleach is good for sanitizing your containers and for killing soil mold, algae, or botrytis. Solution: Mix ¼ cup per 5 gallons of water. Reminder, always water your plants before applying bleach or fungicides to the plants soil.*



WOULD YOU BELIEVE WHAT'S IN A NAME

Would you believe—that there are over 5,000 named varieties of fuchsias since the first one was discovered in 1703.

Would you believe—that fuchsias are named mostly after people, usually a relative or good friend of the hybridizer at first choice, or then a well-known celebrity as second. There are hundreds of given names for fuchsias such as 'Georgeana', 'Marilyn', 'Errol', etc. In 1967, out of 51 new introductions, 12 had proper names and 9 had given names. The best way to get your name on a fuchsia is to become a friend of a hybridizer or, better still, become a hybridizer yourself and then you can be sure.

Would you believe—that the longest fuchsia name is 24 letters long, in three words, 'Basket Strawberry Festival', introduced by Haag in 1956. Now hear this for the longest single word name, 'Longipedunculate.' It is a form of *F. magellanica macrostema* and I doubt that it is now on the market.

Would you believe—that the fuchsia is the only flower which has been named for practically every bay area city and town plus other coastal towns in California. Over 75 towns and cities in California have had fuchsias named for them.

Would you believe—that there are less than 10 fuchsias which have been named for a state by their proper names such as 'Alaska', 'California', 'Montana', 'Oregon' and 'Texas', etc.

Would you believe—that the third ranking source of fuchsia names is the weather and the heavens above. People see fuchsias as 'Falling Stars', 'Shooting Stars', 'Spring Showers', 'Sunshine', 'Pink Clouds', 'Midnight Sun', 'Raindrops', etc. If you concentrate on these varieties enough you, too, will see how well the name fits. I believe that all of us have a little hippie in us.

Would you believe—that out of the names of the famous female beauties hybridizers seem to carry away themselves a little and see something else in the fuchsia than what other people see. Take



for example, 'Fan Dancer', 'The Madame', 'Geisha', 'Parisienne', etc., and then we also have 'Lazy Lady', 'Swiss Miss', 'Dilly Dilly', 'Shy Lady', and 'Lady Beth'. There are also enough fuchsia names to outfit one of these girls from head to toe starting with 'Easter Bonnet' through 'Wedding Gown' and on down to 'Silver Slippers'.

Would you believe—that some fuchsia names get rather "mushy" such as 'Heart Throb', 'Luscious', 'First Love', 'Glorious', 'True Love', 'Loveable' and 'Sweetheart'. There must be something to it as these are some of the better fuchsia varieties.

Would you believe—that you can almost hear music from some of the varieties such as 'Calypso', 'Swingtime', 'Melody', 'Ting-A-Ling', etc. Now I think I am getting mushy myself.

Would you believe—titles, particularly regal titles, are one of the largest topics for names such as 'Miss California', 'Gypsy Queen', 'Gypsy Prince', 'President', 'His Excellency', etc. You could practically make a movie with 'Ben Hur', 'Caesar' and 'Cleopatra',

'Queen of Sheba', 'Emperor' and 'Ziegfield Girl'.

Would you believe—(and this is a fact)—that no fuchsia variety has ever been described as having the color "fuchsia" within the last twenty-five years. The reason for this is probably that the fuchsia was named after a person, Dr. Leonard Fuchs, and not after any color. The color, fuchsia, was applied to a dye called fuchsin, named after the fuchsia. This dye has a magenta color and when people correlate fuchsia colors I believe it is the magenta red and purple that they think of. It would be interesting to know whether people correlate the color, fuchsia, with the flower or with one set color. For another fact, with as many fuchsias as we have in the purple tones, I don't think anyone can name a dozen with purple in the name, such as 'Purple Beauty', 'Purple Sage', 'Royal Purple', etc.

Would you believe—that the one true color that we do not have is blue (which stays blue and does not fade to another tone) but there are more

fuchsias named with blue than any other color. Pink is the next most popular color name.

Would you believe—that the fuchsia must look more like a rose than any other flower, at least to the hybridizers, as there are more than a dozen varieties with rose in their names. There are ‘Rambling Rose’, ‘Chrystal Rose’, ‘Dusky Rose’, ‘Rosebud’, etc. Yet, I believe you will hear more people say that a fuchsia looks more like a baby orchid than any other flower but the only orchid name I can come up with is ‘Royal Orchid’.

Would you believe—that I could go on forever. There are categories in animals and birds, fairy tales, toys, black magic, water and fire and let’s not forget foods such as ‘Crepe Suzette’, ‘Cotton Candy’, ‘Orange Drops’, ‘Plum Puddin’, ‘Strawberry Sundae’, ‘Taffy’, etc. As I hear some of my customers say, “They look good enough to eat.”

Now, to be serious for a while. I believe that naming a fuchsia is one of the most important parts of

hybridizing and also is the most fun. For the new beginners I believe that some time should be spent thinking out a good name. The name should fit the fuchsia. If the fuchsia is so outstanding that it makes no difference what the name may be then it is a different matter. I think that you will agree with me that many names fit extremely well such as ‘Orange Drops’, ‘Swingtime’, ‘Pink Galore’, ‘Dusky Rose’, ‘Igloo’, ‘Satellite’ and ‘Tropic Sunset’. It is hard to think of them called by any other name now.

In naming fuchsias after your relative make sure, if you want to stay popular, to pick out an excellent fuchsia, such as ‘Papa Blues’. Otherwise, it may fall along the wayside as so many have. People do not enjoy purchasing fuchsias with personal names unless the variety is really outstanding.

In naming a fuchsia for a prominent person or for a town the proper thing to do is to notify the person of your intentions and to determine if he or she would accept the honor of their name being used. If it is to be a surprise,



then a group should check to see if the variety to be named is worthy of the person to be honored. Mr. Machado did this very elegantly when he presented Governor Pat Brown a plant of the same name. This took a lot of planning and experience. Also, Cathy MacDougall was presented with hers by the British Fuchsia Society on her visit to Great Britain.

Another good show on how to present fuchsias to popular people was put on by the San Francisco Branch for Mrs. Violet Roth, Arthur Fritz and Ed Lagarde at their 25th Anniversary Party. In any of these cases, even if the fuchsia variety never develops to be the tops, they will still remember it by its presentation.

Just don't name a variety for someone and wait for them to see it for the first time in the March Bulletin list of new introductions as I believe that this would be a great letdown. This also applies to naming varieties for towns unless the hybridizer is an active part of the town or has some special interest in it. I do not think that a fuchsia should be named for either a person

or a town just for the sake of naming the fuchsia. Someone in the future may really care about the name and would wish to give the person or town something with a really special meaning; unless you have the backing of a group such as the chamber of Commerce, the A.F.S. Branch or some similar organization.

There are no rules on how fuchsia should be named, and I don't think that there should really be any, but I do believe that there should be both good judgment and good taste and then it can be lots of fun.*

INTERNATIONAL FUCHSIA REGISTRY 2024

*Fuchsia cultivars registered during the year ending
31 December, 2023*

The American Fuchsia Registration Service was established in 1954 to work toward eliminating duplicate cultivar names. The International Society for Horticultural Science appointed the American Fuchsia Society the International Registration Authority for Fuchsia Cultivars in 1967. The Society encourages all fuchsia hybridizers to register their cultivars. At the same time, we strongly urge that all new cultivars be thoroughly tested and evaluated before they are named and registered. Each new fuchsia that is offered to the public should be distinctly better or different from existing varieties.



In memory of Ed Salome: AFS and the international fuchsia community lost a good friend when Ed Salome passed away in 2021. I met and got to know Ed and his love of fuchsias through his visits to my nursery in Oregon and the times we visited at fuchsia conventions. I appreciated his efforts as the AFS International Registrar for Fuchsias as well. On several occasions, he helped me navigate through the process of registering my own new introductions. I had huge shoes to fill and a steep learning curve when I took over the Registrar position in 2023. Having served in the position and working through the registration process this past year, I can assure you that Ed gave a lot of his personal time and effort over the 22 years he served in the role of International Registrar for Fuchsias.

I appreciate and thank the efforts and assistance given by Jan de Groot and Mrs. Jannie Loef of the Dutch Fuchsia Society, Nederlandse Kring van Fuchsiavrienden (NKvF). They collect all the fuchsia registrations as they are entered on the NKvF website. They pass on the registration information to me. They act as the liasons between me and the European hybridizers when I have a question about a registration. They also pass on direction to the NKvF web master if problems are detected with the AFS section of the NKvF web site or on-line registration form.

Notes on Registration Descriptions

1. Registration forms are typically submitted by the hybridizers during the period from September through November 15th. The descriptions are developed from the forms by the Registrar. The Registrar then issues certificates and complete descriptions of the new cultivars to the hybridizers. The descriptions are then abbreviated and forwarded to the AFS Bulletin Editor, Rodney Bergquist, for publication.
2. There was no acting Registrar in 2022 so there were no registrations processed in 2022. Registrations published in this Bulletin were submitted over the two-year period of 2022 and 2023. The description reflects which year the registration form was submitted.
3. A very abbreviated set of 2022 and 2023 descriptions are provided in this Bulletin. More comprehensive digital descriptions in the form of a long description in MS Word or spreadsheet version in MS Excel. They are available free upon request via e-mail to <AFS.Registrar@gmail.com>.
4. Some organizations in Europe recognize new cultivars for distinctiveness or attractiveness. We have mentioned the following award, certificate, etc. in the description if the hybridizer informed us:
 - Nominated by NKvF (*Nederlandse Kring van Fuchsiavrienden*) as Recommendable Cultivar: Awarded by the Dutch Fuchsia Society for exceptional cultivars.
 - V.K.C. Aalsmeer: Included in a Dutch fuchsia show with high standards for entry.
 - Waanrode: These fuchsias were submitted by hybridizers to be reviewed by a board of examiners with high standards for approval. An “Outstanding” rating is given for exceptional cultivar entries.

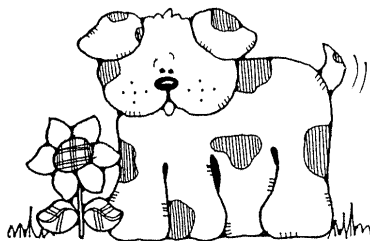
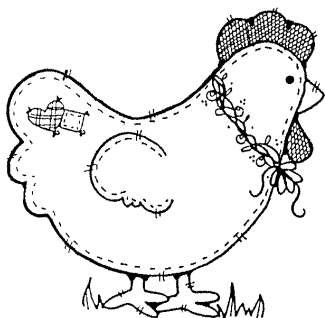


- Fuchsia Nieuwigheden Certificating: A certification by hybridizer Waldenmaier that his introductions are new, unique and of excellent quality.

5. NKvF, in association with the AFS, has a digital form to register new cultivars. The form can be found on the site (www.NKvF.nl) under the heading of 'AFS'. The form is available in different languages. Besides English and Dutch, the form is also available in German and French.

- Read the instructions for use before selecting the form. It is recommended to first download a PDF of the form to fill out prior to starting to fill out the on-line digital form. After filling out the digital form, select 'Save and submit form.' An automatic response will be sent to inform that the form has been submitted.
- The NKvF will check the form for accuracy and then send a copy of the completed form to the hybridizer. The hybridizer checks the form for errors and reports changes, if any, back to NKvF. The form is then sent to the AFS Registrar who will issue certificates and complete descriptions to the hybridizers. Abbreviated descriptions are written for publication in the American Fuchsia Society Spring Bulletin.

The Effects of Light

The importance of light in the growing of fuchsias is not generally discussed when considering fuchsia culture. The notion that fuchsias are 'shade plants' is actually erroneous. Few fuchsias will tolerate deep shade. A certain amount of full sun in the morning is important and beneficial; some fuchsias will tolerate full sun (particularly tryphylls hybrids such as 'Gartenmeister Bonstedt', although even with these, the hot afternoon sun is best avoided to get the best results.

In any case, most fuchsias respond to 'full light' as contrasted with full sun. The effect of light on fuchsias can best be studied in coastal areas where fog is prevalent during a great part of the growing season. Light filtered through a high fog seems to be to a fuchsia's liking. The size of the blossoms is dramatic compared to those grown in sunny climates, but the colors are somewhat paler or softer. Since it is usually cool in foggy areas, it takes longer for the fuchsia to come to full size and open. In less foggy areas,

filtered light will produce the best results with fuchsias—lush green growth, an abundance of blossoms and blossoms that have vibrant color.

Filtered light is achieved by growing fuchsias under overhanging trees or structures. If the light is filtered by an overhanging tree, just be sure that the tree is not so dense that it is casting deep shade. If a structure is used, the same rule applies. The best structure is an overhead of 'shade cloth', that is plastic fiberglass or metal screening. Shade cloth comes in a variety of textures designed to let in varying degrees of light. Since the degree of light is evenly spread and more or less constant during the day, shade cloth produces the best possible results. If shade cloth is impractical for one reason or another, the lath house can be useful to filter the light and produce good results.

Just after pruning, while the days are still relatively short and the sunlight is relatively weak, the plants can be placed in full sun. This will spur new growth. During the late Spring, while the pinching program is in progress



bear in mind that the greater the amount of light the shorter the spacing between alternate pairs of leaves on a stem will be. Direct sun at this time will tend to keep close internode spacing. This is beneficial for the purpose of producing as many laterals as possible in a small a space as possible. Then, if one wishes to get long sweeping laterals (on a basket or standard) the plant can be moved to a less sunny (more shaded) location where internode spacing will become greater. However, in the case of bushes, it is better to give as much light as possible during the whole growing season. This usually results in somewhat smaller blossoms than on plants grown under filtered light, but in this case it can be considered desirable.*
